Prayers of Preparation

Prayers of Penitence

Hear the words of the angel to Joseph:

'You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

Therefore, let us seek the forgiveness of God Through Jesus the saviour of the world.

Silence is kept for us to offer our sins to God.

we have sinned against thee

The Sermon

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The word made flesh is the light of the world, by your incarnation you embraced our poverty: by your spirit may we share in your riches.

The Holy Communion

We remember Christ's offering of himself for us and his last supper with his disciples, blessing the bread and wine to be for us his body and blood.

Stand

It is very meet, right and our bounden duty, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto thee.

O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God, through Jesus Christ thine only Son our Lord.

Through him you have redeemed us from the slavery of sin, giving him to be born of a woman, to die upon the cross, and to rise again for us.

Through him you have made us a people of your own possession, exalting him to your right hand on high, and sending forth through him your holy and life-giving Spirit.

And now we give yout thanks because, by the power of the Holy Spirit, he took our nature upon him and was born of the Virgin Mary his mother, that being himself without sin, he might make us clean from all sin. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify your glorious name, evermore praising you and saying:

All Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Glory be to you, O Lord most high.
Blessed is he that comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be unto us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: Drink you all of this; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as ofent as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of his kingdom and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of thy divine majesty, renew us by thy Holy Spirit, inspire us with thy love, and unite us in the body of thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty, world without end.
