Collect

Risen Christ, for whom no door is locked, no entrance barred: open the doors of our hearts, that we may seek the good of others and walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace, to the praise of God the Father.

Acts 5:27-32;

²⁷ When they had brought them, they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, ²⁸ saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us.' ²⁹ But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than any human authority. ³⁰ The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. ³¹ God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour, so that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. ³² And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.'

John 20:19-31

¹⁹ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' ²⁸ Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' ²⁹ Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

A Thought for Sunday: John 20:19-31

A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God! "Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

The wonderful story of Thomas, his doubts and belief, but I wonder what did Jesus have to endure to get to this point. He had died a most painful death, not just on the cross but by being scourged to near death beforehand and whilst that sounds like enough to have to endure, was that all? The Easter Day liturgy says, "this is the day when our Lord Jesus Christ was raised gloriously from the dead, crushing the power of sin and destroying the sting of death." To destroy something means to demolish, to ruin, to put an end to, or to kill. So what happened between 3.00pm on Good Friday and Easter morning. Just how did Christ destroy, sin, death, hell and the Devil and at what cost? Clearly, there was a lot at stake, but Christ endured it all, just out of love for us.

- As we reflect through this Easter season, when death turns to life, may ponder the enormity of your sacrifice, of what you had to endure, just out of love for us. May thay fill us with love for you and compassion for neighbour.
- We remember in our prayers those we have loved but no longer see. As Christ crushed death and opened the gates of eternity to all believers, fill us with your hope and joy, that the Easter message may shine in our hearts.
