Galatians 6:7-10;

⁷ Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. ⁸ If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. ⁹ So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. ¹⁰ So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith.

Luke 10:1-11, 16

10 After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ² He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say,

"Peace to this house!" ⁶ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. ⁸ Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ cure the sick who are there, and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." ¹⁰ But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, ¹¹ "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near."

¹⁶ 'Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me.'

PARISH PRAYERS FOR W/C SUNDAY 6TH JULY

A Thought for Sunday:

10 After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. ² He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. ³ Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. ⁴ Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road.

This story about the seventy-two has for me, a strong sense of chaplaincy about it. One moment in the comfort zone of Jesus' entourage, the next sent out in pairs to towns and villages. Jesus knew quite a bit about being in other people's spaces, because he didn't have a space of his own, he was always in someone else's space, but somehow at the same time was always the host. His instructions to the seventy-two were to be both guest and host. When we walk into another's space as a guest we might encounter a freewheeling conversation, but when that changes to story of difficulty, cares or concerns, It's important to become the host, to receive their cares and concerns, to listen and hear the reality of their situation and feelings.

For our Local Ministry Work and Schools

- Lord we pray that you lead us and strengthen us to be both a guest and host when we are in someone else's space. Help us to hear and listen to the other with compassion and love.
- Let us pray over the continuing tensions of war in our world, as we bring our concerns for Israel, Gaza, Iran, Ukraine, Russia and conflicts of Africa before God. In particular we pray for the innocent people whose lives and homes are destroyed.
- We give thanks for the wonderfully success of both the flower festival and the Summer Sizzler BBQ. Help us to remember that it is in these community events that we find out what you are already doing and feel your invitation to join in.
- We pray for all of those who are seeking God in their lives, who need His presence and comfort today. May the God of love and compassion draw ever closer to them.
- We pray for all our schools throughout this community, who are coming to the end of another school year. We pray that they do so joyfully and also enjoy the rest of the holidays to come. We also pray of the whole community of the Royal School, which had its closing ceremony yesterday.
