A Thought for Sunday: Philippians 4:4-9

'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.' What St Paul was talking about here is how we can be the kinds of people who are ready to care and share. God can work through as those who help when people are worrying. When we know other people are looking out for us, when we know other people care, some how we then feel better and more settled. We shouldn't imagine that everyone is fine, just because we don't see their troubles, or because they are too ashamed to ask. But we live in a community where we have ways to care for those less well-off than ourselves. Haslemere Foodbank is one of those ways. Today we support Haslemere Food Bank, but really what we are doing is to care for others we don't even know.

- On Harvest Festival Sunday we pray with thanks for Haslemere Food Bank, with their work to collect and share all which is donated to them. Especially we pray for their team and the heavy work they do unseen.
- We pray for all who are worried and concerned for their health, and of those who

- We pray for the Den group, who will be presenting their Supermarket Challenge this week. May all who see them be generous to the cause of sharing in the town.
