A Thought for Sunday: Matthew 24:36-44

'But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.

But true repentance I think is loaded with a deep and wide sense of one's ability to become separate from God. Yes, we turn away from our sin – that is true, but it's the turn to Christ which gives repentance it's full value. That is to be lived at all times. There is a sort of spiritual proximity to God that comes into play – how near are we to God? This idea of repentance as preparation, rather than reaction is at the heart of what Jesus teaches us today.

- Begin again O Lord your glorious journey into the hearts of our lives. Lead us to repentance and renewal, in the deepest parts of our lives.
- Bless the children in your name dear Lord. Teach our young people the joy of faith and service.

- Bring calm and perspective to our parliament and society we pray. Teach us that life is not all about gain and growth of money alone.
